

Wildlife Education Internship (Paid)

The Blue Ridge Wildlife Center (BRWC) is a full-service wildlife hospital & rehabilitation facility that provides 60-100 education programs a year to all ages, reaching over 4,000 children & adults, covering topics from natural history of native wildlife to conservation issues. The BRWC is looking for students interested in helping staff develop & lead education programs during the summer months.

Learning Opportunities Include: Native wildlife identification & handling techniques, nutrition, husbandry, natural history of our education Ambassador species; development of existing & potential educational programming; discussions on the use, care, & training of Ambassador animals in educational programming.

Intern Expectations and Responsibilities:

Full or part-time summer internship opportunities are available. Full-time interns work 40+ hours/week; parttime interns work 30+ hours/week. Housing may be available for full-time interns that live outside a 50 mile radius from the Center. Internships run from <u>May through August</u>, & interns must be able to work a flexible schedule including weekends & holidays.

Interns will receive a stipend as follows:

Full-time, no housing - \$200/week. Full-time w/ housing - \$100/week. Part-time - \$100/week. Interns will have several areas of responsibility including:

- Cleaning and maintaining caging for BRWC's resident Animal Ambassadors.
- Assisting staff at educational programming.
- Assisting staff in the development of lesson plans & education programs including pre-K through middle school topics, summer camp activities & lessons, & adult & family programs held at the BRWC.
- Recording pertinent information about past & present programs in Excel.
- Preparation of wild animal artifacts (biofacts)
- Organization of current education materials & research into new materials to enhance BRWC's education department.

This work can be physically demanding & fast-paced. Interns must be in good physical condition & able to work outdoors during hot weather conditions. Interns wishing to work with mammals must have proof of prerabies vaccine or titer in the last 2 years. All interns must be fully Covid-19 vaccinated before their start date.
