Wildlife Rehabilitation Interns, Blue Ridge Wildlife Center

The Blue Ridge Wildlife Center (BRWC) is a wildlife hospital and rehabilitation center located in Boyce, Virginia, caring for 1,900 native mammals, birds, and reptiles annually. The care and feeding of so many animals requires a great deal of time and attention. The BRWC provides qualified students the opportunity to get hands-on experience assisting with the care and feeding of these animals.

Learning opportunities include: Native wildlife species identification and handling techniques, nutrition and husbandry of native wild species, rehabilitation of injured and orphaned wildlife, knowledge of wildlife diseases and toxins.

Wildlife Rehabilitation Intern: Six month internships extend from April 1 to Sept. 30, 2014. Interns will work a flexible schedule of 50+ hours per week, and must be willing to work weekends, evenings, and holidays.

Requirements: Minimum of 2 years of college education or relevant work experience. Applicants must be vaccinated against the rabies virus and tetanus. They must be in good physical condition and able to lift a minimum of 50 lbs. This work is physically demanding and fast paced. Interns must be in good physical condition and able to work outdoors during hot weather conditions.

Application Procedure: Please send a resume, cover letter, and 2 letters of recommendation by March 1st. Please indicate that you are applying for a 6 month internship, and whether you need housing.

- Hand-feeding young orphan birds and mammals, using a variety of techniques.
- Cleaning and maintaining caging for a wide variety of wildlife species (mammals, birds, reptiles).
- Preparing diets for a wide variety of species
- Keeping records on all patients and entering data into our computer database.
- Learning how to recognize signs of illness in young birds and mammals and to notify BRWC Staff.
- Assisting staff with wildlife rescues and releases as needed.

This work is physically demanding and fast paced. Interns must be in good physical condition and able to work outdoors during hot weather conditions.
